
Artists can... *observe*.

Grades K-2 Options

1. Looking at Art

1. Use your detective eye to look at this picture for 30 seconds, then, cover it up.
2. Draw, write down, or tell another person everything you saw in the picture.
3. Imagine you can jump into this picture...
 - Where would you land?
 - What would you be doing in the picture?
 - What else might you see?
 - What do you hear or smell?

2. Draw from observation




Grades 3-5 Options

1. Looking at objects

1. Fold a piece of paper in quarters.



2. Find a small object in your house that you can draw (you need to be able to pick it up and turn it around for different perspectives).
3. Now look closely... and draw different parts of the object in each box on your paper. See how many details you can draw.
4. Color your picture anyway you would like.



2. Draw from observation

1. Gather a pencil and paper.
2. Choose a window in your home, and using your super powers of observation, draw everything you see.
3. Make sure you add LOTS of interesting details, lines, textures, and patterns.
4. What do you see in the foreground (front), middleground (middle) and background?
